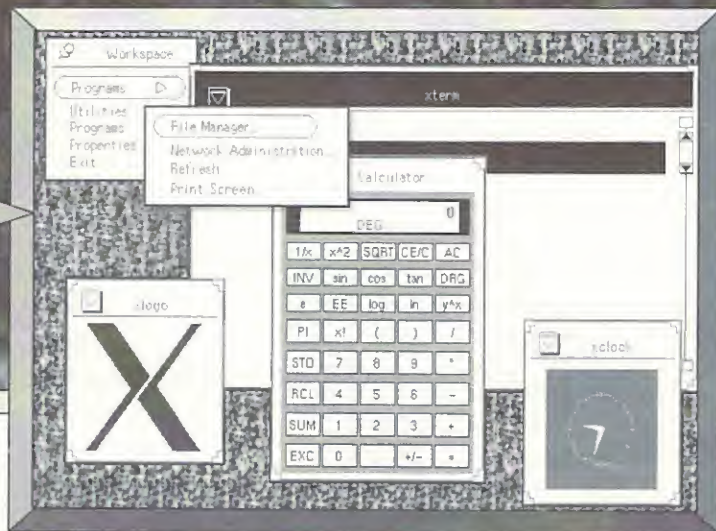

# Are you running out of .info?

To check on when you'll need to renew look at the numbers on your mailing label - it should look something like this:

27 . 12 . 38 . 32.

The first number was your first issue, the second equals the total number of issues to your credit, the third number shows which issue will be your last issue, and the fourth number indicates the issue from which the label came. If the fourth number has <--- LAST next to it, that indicates that that issue is your last unless you renew. To make sure that you don't miss any issues, send in your renewal order an issue or two before you are due to expire.



## NEW PRODUCTS

**I**NOVAtronics has two add-on products to use with *CanDo*, their multimedia applications generator. **Intro Pak** is a 7-deck tutorial to guide the neophyte through the intricacies of working with *CanDo*, while **Pro Pak 1** includes some games, a paint program, and some extensions to *CanDo* itself. **N**eural networks are the latest thing in artificial intelligence research and if you've been curious about them, *MegageM*'s newest product, **NeuralPro**, will give you the opportunity to dive into the field. The program operates within the architecture of what is called 3-layer back-propagation and supports up to 192 network elements (commonly referred to as 'neurons') and 4096 interconnections. It uses a color-graphic metaphor, which provides the means for analyzing the process. **A** *Defender*-type blast-fest, *Anarchy* offers nothing in the way of innovation but loads in the way of fast action and joystick-jerking breathlessness. The idea is to eliminate aliens while protecting your life-support canisters. The fine graphics and blazing parallax scrolling give a satisfying illusion of depth. The number of animated bad guys to blast at is almost overwhelming. (Actually, they frequently *are* overwhelming.) Trademark Psygnosis graphics and stereo music support the ensemble. ## HYPERBOOK

**G**old Disk has announced a new software title called *HyperBook*, which they call a "free-form personal information manager." Intended as an alternative to authoring systems, *HyperBook* is intended to be used for day-to-day tasks, while still being capable of creating stand-alone specialized database applications or interactive presentations. The program can be popped open at any time to jot down notes and diagrams without advance planning, which can later be turned into a database, presentation, or teaching tool. *HyperBook* is a multimedia database that combines text and graphics on the electronic "pages" of computerized "books." Actions can be attached to objects on the pages, linking any object with new pages or other graphical or textual data with the click of a mousebutton. Included are a built-in graphical text editor supporting multiple fonts and a multifaceted built-in drawing editor. IFF support includes cropping, color remapping, scaling, and resizing.

If you've been speculating what the new A3500 "tower case" Amiga 3000 might look like, our sources indicate it will look a lot like the unit pictured here, which is Commodore's PC60-III. Note the two 3.5" and two 5.25" drive bays.
